Sustainability, with its several principles, is one of the strongest emerging trends in kitchen and bath design today. For example, as a homeowner you may be particularly concerned about healthy home design that promotes well-being for yourself and your family. In addition, energy and water efficiency has most likely become very important to you because it lowers your utility bills.

Control Your Faucet

While you are preparing meals in your kitchen, it goes without saying that your hands will become messy. Of course, you do not want to spread germs by touching your kitchen faucet. There are many different ways to activate a faucet these days without actually touching it, and it is a good idea to carefully consider each one before you make your purchase.

Motion sensor (or Touchless) faucets allow water to flow when motion is detected. You do not have to touch the faucet with messy hands. This feature can help save water, since it will automatically turn off the water when there is no motion.

Touch-sensitive (or Touch-On) faucets will activate with a simple tap anywhere on the faucet. You could use your wrist or elbow, when your hands are messy. This is a much less expensive option than a motion sensor faucet.

FootControl faucets by GROHE are a new option designed for situations when you simply cannot get your hands in a position to turn on the faucet—either by motion or touch—such as when you are holding a heavy pot of water with both hands. A FootControl sensor mounted to the underside of your cabinet connects to a control box that sits inside your cabinetry. Gently tap the sensor with your foot to turn the water on and off. When you do not need to use the foot control, the faucet will still function like a standard kitchen faucet.

Beautiful Bathroom Remodel in Collettsville

As a previous client of ours, this family knew who to call when it was time to remodel their bathroom in their beautiful Collettsville area mountain home. Also as a recipient of our quarterly print newsletter, they wanted a space that could be featured in one of our articles!

When Cody met with the couple about their project, it was clear that they needed better storage options, a more user friendly space, and some safety features. During the Project Development Phase, a budget was established with the client. Starting out, we provide basic floorplans to get an idea of how the new space will function. Once we have adjusted the allowances and all the products are selected, we can provide the final drawings and realistic 3D Model photos using our Softplan Drawing Software. During this time a fixed contract price is set as well as a realistic timeline for the project.

We began by taking the existing bathroom down to its original framing because of some mold growth on the ceiling that was caused by improper ventilation and a hidden water leak. A "can fan" was chosen, which looks like a regular recessed light but is also a bath fan! This allowed us to keep the ceiling looking clean and fresh while still providing proper ventilation. We installed a new recessed medicine cabinet, a counter height vanity, and a custom open bookcase for towel storage. The Homecrest cabinets feature 'SoftClose' drawers and doors to prevent slamming. We met the client at a local countertop showroom to select the perfect Dakota Mahogany stone countertop.



Everybody wants a beautiful shower! They really do. Lots of people ask us for beautiful showers, but we here at Vision Design know that function is very important too. Cody Byrd, the owner of the company says "We can make anything beautiful, but it's easier with a proper plan and good design." We want to make all our projects beautiful *and* safe.

Next in the bathroom remodel, we waterproofed the shower area with the Schluter Tile System- Kerdi Membrane. This insures that everything remains dry behind the tiles for years to come. We installed a Temp-Assure Delta Lahara faucet system. You can preset the water temperature of the shower to your liking and just cut it on and off each time! With a fixed head and a hand held sprayer on a slide bar, our clients will have plenty of options for water flow. We installed a beautiful tile design complete with a mosaic band and tile on the ceiling. Some of the safety features in the shower include a custom built-in shower seat, custom bypass shower doors, and a grab bar.

Installing a pocket door system allowed for more room instead of a bulky door. The new tile floor with a pinwheel pattern adds interest to the small, yet spacious area. The walls were painted 'Antiquarian Brown' with Sherwin Williams ProMar 400 satin finish for easy cleaning. New base molding and casings were stained 'Fruitwood' to match the home's existing interior. These finishing touches really made the space the perfect fit for our clients.
